A one-day multi-disciplinary conference for researchers and primary care practitioners with an interest in adolescent health and well-being.

In 2006 The Trust for the Study of Adolescence (TSA), The Centre for Research in Primary and Community Care (CRIPACC) and The Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP) Adolescent working party for adolescents, jointly hosted the first 'what works conference' on Young People and Health Research.

The aim of this second conference is to further increase the dialogue between practitioners and the research community on key issues relating to the health and well-being of adolescents.

Potential contributors should submit an abstract of maximum 250 words for either a parallel paper session, poster or workshop by 30th May 2008.

The organisers welcome theoretical and empirical presentations and from any methodological tradition.

Contributions are particularly welcomed that address any of the following themes:

- Resilience and assets
- Young peoples participation, especially in health care decision-making
- The internet and new ICT's
- Sexual health
- Food and nutrition
- Primary health care

- BME young people
- School nursing
- Methodological issues involved in researching young people's health

ABSTRACT submissions for oral presentations, workshops or posters need to include the following:

1. Full contact details of presenting author (address, email and telephone)
2. Title
3. Preferred method of presentation
4. Relevant conference theme

It would be helpful if abstracts conformed to a traditional structure (where appropriate) of background, aims, methods, findings, conclusion.
